The results of the race for prosecutor is clear proof that Negroes gain nothing from alignment "with either of the two major parties", a spokesman for Detroit CORE said this week.

Don Roberts, new chairman of CORE, said "I am sorely disappointed at the race for county prosecutor and the outcome."

Roberts said the contest raises the question on the part of Negroes "of whether or not they can fruitfully align themselves with parties."

Commenting on the councilmanic race in which Thomas Poindexter won over Jackie Vaughn II, Roberts said Poindexter's election "gives a true measurement of where Detroit actually is, rather than the unfaithfully pretty image projected by some persons."

Bradford Nichols, chairman of CORE voter registration committee, added that no "Negro running against a white candidate can defeat that candidate when the Negro population of the city is only one-third."

3 Sit-ins Lectured, Set Free

Three Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) members were given a lecture and granted probation Monday for an Oct. 2 sit-in at the Automobile Club of Michigan main office at 139 Bagley.

Recorder's Judge John P. O'Hara postponed for a week the sentencing of a fourth member who disputed police records indicating two prior convictions.

All four pleaded guilty.

O'Hara told them they had taken the law into their hands, and had injured their cause.

O'Hara then called Charles Russel to the bench and told him his case was different because he has two convictions for engaging illegally in the sale of whisky.

Russel, 24, of 2060 W. Euclid, denied the convictions, saying there had been a mistake in records.
