Summary and analysis of cases investigated by the Citizen

Complaint Bureau in 1965

The Citizen Complaint Bureau investigated 105 cases involving 108 complainants in 1965. Wherey complaints were from Negroes, 17 from Whites and one complaint was from a Mexican.

Of the 105 cases received, thirty of them were also investigated by the Michigan Civil Rights Commission, involving 37 complainants.

Explanation of Categories:

Verbal abuse - Racial slurs, abusive or profane language, insults, etc.

Physical abuse - Excessive physical contacts

Misconduct - Harassment, insufficient police service, discourtesy, failure to enter complaint

Improper Police procedure - False arrest, improper issuance of tickets, excessive incarceration, denial of police service
