Major highlights for the meeting will include an address by Rev. Lucas Walker, New York City's militant Black minister representing the Interreligious Foundation for Community Organizations. Rev. Walker will speak on the Black Struggle for Liberation and the role his organization is playing.

An expose, by Rev. Albert B. Cleage, of a plot to re-enslave Black people, as perpetrated by the Metropolitan Authority (a funding Agency), will be most enlightening. Come out and listen to Rev.
