Under military control by order of President Roosevelt, Detroit awoke today to a semblance of order invoked by machine guns and tanks, the bayonets and rifles of 2,300 U.S. soldiers and the pistols of 4,000 policemen.

President Roosevelt directed Secretary of War Stimson to use the armed forces of the United States to quell the rioting, which he termed "insurrectionary."

At the same time, the President commanded all Detroiters to halt the violence.

The list of dead, however, climbed during the night to 25-22 of them Negroes.
